

MAYOR CARLSON AND COMPLETE CITIZENS' TICKET IS ELECTED

Chief Executive Is Chosen for Eleventh
Term Over T. N. Nelson by
1,010 Plurality

PRESENT COUNCILMEN WIN

City Council to Be Composed of Fred V. Anderson, Harry J. Holroyd, Leon F. Roberts, Theodore P. Vimmerstedt, J. William Sanbury, William S. Hake, Lawrence A. Howard, William J. Anderson, Ernest C. Carlson, Oscar W. Swanson, Charles A. Anderson and Harry C. Erickson—Six Supervisors Elected Without Opposition

Mayor Samuel A. Carlson was chosen as the executive head of the Jamestown city government for his 11th term at the election on Tuesday, his plurality over Theodore N. Nelson being 1,010. The mayor secured a total of 4,841 votes, as against 3,831 for Nelson and 626 for Gilbert T. Anderberg. City elections in Jamestown are of a non-partisan character and Mayor Carlson, a Republican, ran on what was designated the Citizens' ticket; Mr. Nelson, a Democrat, on the Progressive ticket, and Mr. Anderberg as a Communist, using the name of that party.

The entire Citizen's party ticket of twelve Councilmen and six supervisors was elected, all Progressive party, Independent and Communist candidates being defeated. As a result, the City council which takes office Jan. 1 will be composed of 10 of the present members, J. William Sanbury and William S. Hake. Messrs. Sanbury and Hake will replace Councilmen Ernest C. Kessler and John Jenkins who were not candidates for re-election. The new Council will be composed as follows:

Councilmen-at-large—Harry J. Holroyd, Fred V. Anderson, Leon F. Roberts, William S. Hake, Theodore P. Vimmerstedt and J. William Sanbury.

First Ward—Lawrence A. Howard.
Second Ward—William J. Anderson.

Third Ward—Ernest C. Carlson.
Fourth Ward—Oscar W. Swanson.

Fifth Ward—Charles A. Anderson.
Sixth Ward—Harry C. Erickson.
Mayor Carlson carried five of the

six wards in the city—the First by 32; the Third by 70; the Fourth, in which he resides, by 148; the Fifth, in which Mr. Nelson makes his home by 385, and the Sixth by 433. Nelson carried only one ward—the Second, and that by 58. Of the 24 election districts in the city, Mayor Carlson carried 18 and Nelson six.

Harry J. Holroyd led the Councilmanic ticket and Fred V. Anderson was second, while Leon F. Roberts was third. Messrs. Anderson and Holroyd were endorsed by both the Citizens and Progressive tickets. Mr. Roberts led the unendorsed candidates on the Citizen's party ticket. The order in which the successful candidates for Councilman-at-large ran and the number of votes polled by each follows:
