

The Carlsons were married at their home, 25 Maple Street, Jamestown, June 21, 1893, by the Rev. John N. Ahnstrom, of the Swedish Mission Church. Mrs. Carlson, the former Freda S. Hendrickson, was attended by her sister, the late Mrs. Hettie Hendrickson Westerdahl. Amel Carlson served as his brother's best man.

Mrs. Carlson's wedding dress of white silk, trimmed with white lace and white satin ribbons with a long veil, will be worn by Miss Mary Lindbeck, her grandniece, who will be married to Lester W. Berglund, Jr., Wednesday.

Miss Lindbeck, the daughter of Dr. and Mrs. C. Otto Lindbeck, will also carry a white fan, similar to the one Mrs. Carlson carried in her wedding 60 years ago.

Mrs. Carlson, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Oscar Hendrickson, was born in Jamestown in October, 1872. Mr. Carlson was born Oct. 28, 1868, the son of John F. and Louise Carlson.

At the time of the marriage Mr. Carlson had just been elected alderman of the Fourth Ward and serve on the Common Council, although only 25-years-old, he has once entered actively into his Councilmanic work. From that time until 1951 when he retired from public life, he served Jamestown in some official capacity. In

As a councilman and member of the Board of Public Works for many times, Mr. Carlson has been an important factor in the development of Jamestown's municipal

Utilities. He served in this capacity until 1951.

At the close of his term in 1938, Mr. Carlson was named "Mayor Emeritus" of Jamestown by the City Council.

Mr. Carlson was a leader in the State Conference of Mayors and twice ran for Representative in Congress.

Before choosing a public career, Mr. Carlson went into the furniture manufacturing business on lower Willard Street, near Winsor. A short time later he acquired an interest in the Vart Land Publishing Company, publishers of a Swedish weekly. He served as manager of the periodical until some time after becoming mayor.

The Carlsons have one son, Wendell L. Carlson, who is with the Radio Corporation of America at its Princeton, New Jersey, plant. He and Mrs. Carlson were present for Sunday's affair.
