

The New York State Municipal Bulletin, issued by the New York State Conference of Mayors, in its December number, pays tribute to Mayor Emeritus Samuel Carlson and refers to his series of articles in this newspaper last year.

"Samuel Carlson, former Mayor of the City of Jamestown and former President of the Conference of Mayors, is now 87 years old and is probably the only survivor of those public officials that founded our official organization.

"The conference staff has read with interest a series of articles that appeared in The Jamestown Post-Journal in June of 1956 which were written by Mayor Carlson and which relates his experiences in public office over a half of century.

"Mayor Carlson, who served two terms as President of the Conference of Mayors, presently resides at 115 West Summit Avenue, Lakewood. Public officials that remember this outstanding local official may wish to send Mayor Carlson a letter wishing him a very enjoyable retirement and good health."

Daniel A. Isaacson, corporation counsel, who brought the bulletin to the attention of this column, commented that in addition to the many outstanding achievements and contributions of Mayor Carlson, he considers his work in the field of writing as one of the most important and significant.
