## State Conference Makes Award

# Mayor Emeritus Carlson Honor Guest At Dinner

Mayor Emeritus Samuel A. Carlson was honored Monday evening by members of the City Council, past city officers, and a representative of the New York State Conference of Mayors.

Addison Mallory, executive secretary of the conference, presented Mayor Carlson with a special pin, citing him as a "progressive" mayor.

Following a dinner at the Town Club, Mayor Carlson was greeted by present and past city officials in the Council Chambers of City Hall.

Present were Mayor Carl F. Sanford and three other past mayors, including Samuel A. Stroth, Stanley A. Weeks and Harry C.

Erickson. The audience also included a number of city councilmen from past administrations.

Mayor Carlson, who served as Jamestown's chief executive for 26 years, will be 90 in October. He was one of the founders and the third president of the Conference of Mayors.

He was cited for his "lifetime of service" by Mayor Sanford. Mayor Carlson, speaking briefly, expressed his appreciation for the recognition.

Also speaking were Ernest Cawcroft, local attorney, and corporation counsel during the Carlson administration which saw the adoption of the present City Charter, and D. Lawrence Carlson, brother of the Mayor Emeritus.
