Art Metal Ratifies Return Of Executive Offices To City

Geo. A. Hahne Director; Andrew Wilson Quits Posts

Art Metal, Inc., at its board of directors meeting yesterday in New York City, elected two new directors and officially designated Jamestown as location for the executive offices.

George A. Hahne, president of the First National Bank, was named one of the new directors. He replaces Andrew Wilson of Scarsdale, who was chief executive officer of the company at the time the executive offices were moved to New York City in the spring of 1959.

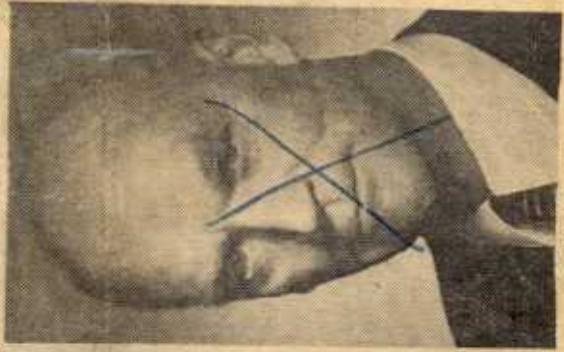
The board at yesterday's meeting accepted the resignation of Mr. Wilson both from the board of directors and the executive committee, of which he was at one time chairman.

As reported in The Post-Journal on Sept. 9, offices of the president and five of his chief management heads are to be located in Jamestown. Only the sales and marketing department remains in New York City.

At that time, Falconer Jones, president and chief executive of the company, said, "Jamestown represents one of the company's largest group of plants in any one location, and is therefore the natural headquarters for the members of top management."

Lineup of the five chief departments now located in Jamestown is: Finance, under Charles H. Brown, assisted by Philip Daugherty; and corporate sales, under Kenneth E. Murray; industrial relations, under Charles V. DeLoe; manufacturing, under Robert R. Davly; and contracts sales, under Roscoe W. Clark and Carl H. Bowen.

The second new board member is W. Cornell Deobert, of New York City, replacing John L. Fie-
