ment, said of the volunteers, "The scramble is terrific. We have about 45 active members, but we roll when from three to five have arrived. Others show up as fast as they can and many travel to fires by car."

Also in 1963 the department purchased a Maxim Firetruck with a 750-gallon tank. The truck was later sold and is still being used by the Limestone Fire Department.

In July, 1976 the company took possession of a 1976 Ford Ariel Truck, known as the "snorkel." It's the only truck of its kind in the area. Its ladders can reach a height of 55 feet and its pump can handle 1,250 gallons per minute.

In the 1980s Station 2 was built at the corner of Cobbe Circle and Hunt Road, and the company's first ambulance was purchased.
