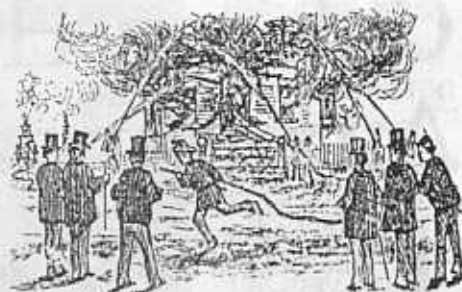


call. Coffee, pop, sandwiches, donuts, and chili are sent to the scene of a fire in rain, freezing snow or whatever the weather.
