

# Refrigerator Fire Opens Sprinkler, Damages Lumber

Several truck loads of partly finished lumber were damaged by water when a refrigerator motor became overheated at Crawford Manufacturing Company, 1061-1071 Allen Street, and caused one sprinkler to open at 6:22 A.M. today.

The refrigerator had become ignited and smoke went throughout the building, Jamestown firemen reported. Companies one, two, three, and Ladders one and two responded to the call.

Firemen answered three other calls Tuesday. Trouble with the electrical service located on the outside of the building at B. F. Goodrich Service Station, 405 West Third Street at 2:14 P.M. sent firemen to the scene. The main switch was pulled out and the light plant notified.

A short circuit in the wiring of a truck owned by Glenn E. Waite at 38 Vega Street was confined to the wiring, according to fire authorities. Company two responded to the call.

Firemen were summoned to West Second and Cherry Streets at 11:21 P.M. to wash gasoline from a car. The car had driven away before the department arrived, firemen reported.
