

Conciliator Wants Meeting

Dahlstrom Strike Parley Proposed

The U.S. Conciliation Service is working to bring union and management together at the strikebound Dahlstrom Metallic Door Company to resume negotiations, it was reported today as the strike of some 600 employes entered its seventh day.

Conciliator Clarence Lamotte of Buffalo could not be reached for comment this morning. However, a reliable source reported he was working to schedule a meeting in the near future.

The union workers, Local 307, United Electrical, Radio & Machine Workers, walked off the job last Tuesday afternoon after a final meeting between company and union officials failed to bring about an agreement.

Local 307 is asking for a general wage increase, a company-paid insurance plan and two additional paid holidays.

Picketing has continued around the clock at the plant's entrances.

Neither the union's general strike committee nor Paul N. Anderson, company president, made any statement today in relation to the strike.

A mediation offer by Mayor Samuel A. Stroth was turned down by the company Friday which answered that "negotiations are being conducted by the U.S. Conciliation Service."

It was reported the union's strike committee had intended to issue a statement today but up until noon no statement had been made.
