

Dahlstrom Talks Will Be Resumed

Officials of Strikebound Plant to Meet With Union

Negotiations between union and company officials at the strikebound Dahlstrom Metallic Door Company will be resumed Thursday at 11 A.M., it was announced today by Federal Conciliator Clarence Lamotte of Buffalo.

The conciliator said he held hopes that "negotiation meetings would continue daily" until contract terms are settled.

The strike of more than 600 workers at the plant, represented by Local 307, United Electrical, Radio & Machine Workers, entered its ninth day today.

The workers walked out of the plant Feb. 7 after a final negotiation meeting with management failed to bring a settlement.

Main issues of the negotiation talk will concern a demand for a general wage increase, a company-paid insurance plan and a demand for two additional holidays.

It was reported Monday the U.S. conciliator was working to bring union and management together again to resume peace talks. The meeting Thursday morning will be held in the Dahlstrom plant office, according to Mr. Lamotte.

Both the general strike committee of the union and Company President Paul N. Anderson declined to comment on the resumption of negotiations.

Picket lines have been maintained on a day and night schedule at the plant's entrances since the beginning of the strike.

Local 307 has been negotiating with the company since Nov. 15, 1949, under terms of a wage re-opener agreement in a previous contract.
