Parley Revived At Dahlstrom's, Results Veiled

Union, Company, Conciliator Silent After First Meet

Negotiations between union and company officials at Dahlstrom Metallic Door Company were resumed at 2 P.M. today after a morning meeting in the plant office. Results of the meeting this morning were not disclosed.

Some 600 members of Local 307, United Electrical, Radio & Machine Workers Union, struck the plant Feb. 7. Negotiations had remained deadlocked until today.

Both Federal Conciliator Clarence Lamotte, and company and union sources have indicated hopes of a settlement in the near future.

Picketing at the plant entrances continued today during the peace talks. The pickets are reporting for 3-hour duty around the clock.

The union has been negotiating with the company since Nov. 15, 1949, under terms of a wage re-opener agreement signed in a previous contract.

Present demands are for a general wage increase, a company-paid insurance plan and two additional paid holidays a year.

With the exception of a statement by the union strike committee at the beginning of the strike, both union officials and management have declined to issue further statements.

Mr. Lamotte made the arrangements for today's resumption of negotiations. He declared earlier he hoped negotiations "would continue daily" until the strike is settled.
