

Parley Resumes At Dahlstrom's

Strike Committee Reports Support

Pickets at Dahlstrom Metallic Door Company plant continued to trudge before the gates today as officials of UE Local 307 and the company sat down at 11 A.M. to continue negotiations aimed at an agreement on wage, insurance and holiday demands.

In a statement issued Monday, the general strike committee of the union said the members have received a "complete and up-to-date report" on the progress of negotiations.

The three - paragraph statement continued: "It was reported that continuous negotiations have been in progress since Thursday, Feb. 16. Negotiations between the company and the union were suspended at 5:30 A.M. Sunday until 2 P.M. Monday.

"Representing the union in negotiations for the past week were: Lewis M. King, president; Carl Malm, vice president; C. Elmer Johnson, financial secretary; Walter Karlson, treasurer; Ray Fransen, recording secretary, and Michael A. Jimenez, international representative."

Demands by the union are: Two additional paid holidays, a company - paid insurance plan and a general wage increase. More than 600 production employes at the Dahlstrom plant went on strike Feb. 7 after negotiations had broken down.
