

Strike Parley Resumed At Dahlstrom's

Negotiations aimed at settling the 25-day-old strike of more than 600 employes at Dahlstrom Metallic Door Company have been resumed, it was reported today.

Talks between company and union officials were broken off last week. Although Federal Conciliator Clarence LaMotte of Buffalo indicated he would be in Jamestown last Wednesday, it was not known whether he sat in the negotiation meeting today.

Demands by the union, UE Local 307, are for a company-paid insurance plan, general wage increase and two additional paid holidays a year. Union sources declined to comment on progress of the negotiations.

Picketing at the plant has continued since the first day of the strike, Feb. 7. The strike has been described by city authorities as "peaceful."

Movies will be shown for the strikers' children at 2 P.M. Saturday, in Nordic Temple.
