

DAHLSTROM'S STRIKE ENDS; TERMS VEILED

Factory Reopening Expected Tuesday Agreement Announced After Union Meet Today

The strike of more than 600 workers at Dahlstrom Metallic Door Company ended shortly after 1 P.M. today, it was confirmed by union sources of UE Local 307.

The workers are expected to return to work Tuesday morning. Picketing at the plant was stopped this afternoon by order of union officials.

Union President Lewis M. King declined to state the terms reached with the company. Demands were for a general wage increase, a company-paid insurance plan and two additional paid holidays a year.

He said he would disclose terms of the settlement in a radio broadcast at 6:20 P.M. Sunday.

The strike was called at 4 P.M. Feb. 7. Local 307 had been negotiating with the company since Nov. 15 under terms of a wage re-opener agreement in a previous contract.

The workers walked out of the plant after a last-minute negotiation meeting with the management failed to bring about a settlement.

Picket lines were maintained at the plant entrances since the first day of the strike.
