

Mayor Stroth and Chief Ericson then talked with the police lieutenant and later called Landy and two pickets into the chief's office. The session lasted nearly an hour and then the group departed.

This morning, Chief Ericson said he had been informed by Mr. Elander, in a telephone conversation, that his AFL employees would not return to the plant for work today.

Mr. Elander said he had not placed any charges for the damage of his vehicle and was uncertain whether or not he will place any charges.

The disturbance was the first reported since the strike of 650 production employees at the Dahlstrom plant began on June 15. Picket lines have been established around the plant since the strike was first called.

Meanwhile, Paul N. Anderson, Dahlstrom president, was scheduled to meet again this afternoon with a union negotiating committee in an attempt to settle the strike. Also representing the company will be Carl T. Bergstrom, Dahlstrom vice president.

A meeting was held Tuesday between union and company representatives but no success was reported.

The union negotiating committee is headed by Andrew P. Anderson, president of Local 307, UE. Representing the UE international organization at the negotiations meetings is Lewis M. King, a former Dahlstrom employe who is now a vice president of the UE and president of UE District 3.
