Cuts Pollution

New Gas-Fired Boiler Unit Is Installed

FALCONER — The boiler at the Dowcraft Corp., 65 S. Dow St., has been converted from coal to gas fuel, thus reducing pollution emissions by more than an estimated 90 per cent, according to company officials.

Roy Gustafson, vice president, said the recently installed unit complies with all existing codes and regulations.

M. A. Larson, secretary-treasurer, said the unit cost more than \$14,000 and was entirely funded by the firm. The unit has a 8,300,000 BTU input capacity for the high pressure steam boiler which heats the plant.

The new unit was installed and operating within a three-week period by the Sans Corp., 1209 E. Second St., Jamestown.

The Dowcraft firm has approximately 75 employes in the manufacture of movable metal office partitions and custom fabrication of metal specialties.
