

Use of Arabol Glue Stressed

Furniture Company Head Testifies

Little Valley — Concluding plaintiff's testimony in the \$50,000 Supreme Court action in damages by the Fancher Furniture Company against the Arabol Manufacturing Company, New York City, was commenced late Wednesday for possible conclusion today.

Resumption of testimony by Firman Simpson, Buffalo, accountant, was to start today, the 13th day of the suit. The case is being tried before Justice Hamilton Ward and jury of nine women and three men.

Chief trial counsel for the plaintiff, Clayton M. Smith, Buffalo, is seeking to establish by the accountant-witness that the claimed damages of approximately \$160,000 were actually sustained.

Fancher company employes were recalled for additional direct examination Wednesday, and repeated claims that only adhesives made by the defendant concern had been used in the furniture which later, it is charged, came apart at glue-joints.

Again Wednesday the most searching cross-examination was reserved for Leonard Erickson, Fancher president, as chief defense counsel Ulysses S. Grant, New York City, sought to gain admissions that the Fancher Company had purchased core stock from outside firms
