Kling Plants Plans Series Of Projects

MAYVILLE—The first of a series of expansion programs estimated to cost more than three quarters of a million dollars is under way at the Kling Factories, Inc., a division of Baumritter's, New York City.

Nathan Ancell, Baumritter president said the first phase of the expansion program here is the construction of a two story concrete block-steel 63,000 square-foot fireproof warehouse, 225 feet long and 140 feet wide.

Other expansions will take place later in Kling's plants, Herrick's, Falconer, and Frewsburg.

The new warehouse will cost in excess of \$100,000, and it will afford the storage and shipment of all Kling made furniture from here via the Pennsylvania Railroad and trucks. The railroad relocated its track siding for the company, and three freight cars will be under one roof.

Kling Factories was sold to Baumritter's two years ago. Kling's was founded about 53 years ago.

Donald D. Kling, Kling's general manager, said the new warehouse will be completed by November.

The new warehouse will have gas control heat; the rest of the plant is steam heated.
