

LOCAL ELECTS NEW OFFICERS:

Talks Set Wednesday

The first negotiating session between labor and management at Kling Factories since a May 1 strike against the operations at Mayville, Falconer and Frewsburg is set for Wednesday, a spokesman for District 65, International Association of Machinists, said today.

He noted that direction of the talks probably will be established at the initial bargaining meeting as both sides present their views in the matter.

About 300 employes at the three manufacturing facilities went on strike after the management refused to recognize Local 2278, I.A.M., as bargaining agent for the workers.

A U.S. District Court decision upheld legality of the National Labor Relations Board election which designated the local to represent the employes.

Pickets have been stationed at the three plants since the strike began but were relieved of these duties after word was received of the court's decision. A Mayville source said some of the pickets already have returned to work at the plant there.

New officers of Local 2278 were elected last night at the I.A.M. district office on Foote Avenue.

Leonard Loveless, Mayville; vice presidents, Janet Little, Falconer; and Paul Anderson, Frewsburg; recording secretary, Joyce Griffin, Frewsburg; secretary-treasurer, Rose Martin, Mayville; conductor-sentinel, Allan Nutt, Frewsburg; trustee 3 years, Karl Anderson; negotiating committee, William Moss, Mayville; Herbert Anderson, Frewsburg; and Eugene Pease, Falconer, who will serve with the officers in this responsibility; and delegates to District 65, Mr. Moss, Janet Little and Ralph Long, Frewsburg.
