# Sullivan Is Chairman For LT Special Gifts

Paul J. Sullivan, senior vice president of the First National Bank of Jamestown, has been named special gifts chairman of the Little Theater of Jamestown Building Fund Campaign.

The announcement was made by general campaign chairman, Sam Paladino.

Mr. Sullivan is a graduate of the Stonier School of Banking at Rutgers University. He served in the U.S. Air Force during World War II and is past president of the Jamestown Kiwanis Club, Mayville Chamber of Commerce and the Moon Brook Country Club.

He served as chairman of the City Republican Committee from 1955 through 1958 and was treasurer of the Chautauqua Boy Scout Council from 1957 to 1964.

Mr. Sullivan is president of the Chautauqua County Bankers Association and is a director of the Jamestown Area Chamber of Commerce and the New York Association for Crippled Children.

He is a member of the Jamestown Chapter, American Institute of Banking, the American Legion, Peacock Lodge F. & A.M., Jamestown Consistory and Ismailia Temple.

Mr. Sullivan was chosen Young Man of the Year in 1956 by the Jamestown Jaycees.

He was chairman of the Jamestown Area Community Chest Campaign in 1955 and

served as chairman of the Mayville Community Chest in 1961.

Mr. Paladino said that membership of Little Theater is currently being contacted for donations following a briefing of the building program during the run of "Barefoot in the Park."

A goal of \$100,000 has been set to complete major renovations of the former Shea's Theater on East Second Street, which is now the new home of the Jamestown Little Theater.

Occupancy of the new building is expected by Jan. 1.
