The one-act award winning play, "Please No Flowers," by American-Italian playwright Joel

Enzana will be presented at 8 p.m. June 17 at Little Theatre as part of the week-long celebration commemorating Jamestown's Italian heritage.

Samuel Paladino, president of Little Theatre, said the nine member cast includes some of the best talent and acting experience in Jamestown. "The quality of our cast and the quality of the script will make for a real cultural evening," he said.

Mr. Paladino described the play as a "bitter-sweet comedy about life. There is more content in this one-act play than is often found in three acts," he said. "It's artfully and culturally written. It follows not just fluff, but art."
