

Lucille Ball Coming Here For Grandfather's Rites

Lucille Ball, screen star, will fly to Jamestown from Hollywood within the next day or two to be present at funeral services for her grandfather, Fred Charles Hunt, former local resident, who died at his home in Beverly Hills, Calif., Jan. 9.

His daughter, Mrs. Desiree E. Ball of Beverly Hills, mother of the film star, arrived in Jamestown yesterday. She accompanied the remains, which are being held at the Partridge Funeral Home, pending the arrival of Miss Ball and final funeral arrangements.

Mr. Hunt, who was born in Jamestown in 1865 and made his home here for many years was for 11 years engaged as a chiropractor in California before his retirement.

In addition to his daughter he is survived by Miss Ball and two other grandchildren, Fred Henry Ball and Mrs. Cleo Morgan, and a great grandchild, Miss Pamela Lee Ball, all of Hollywood.

Although a tragic occasion brings Miss Ball from Hollywood she will probably stay long enough to greet several friends during her short visit. It is not known how long she will stay or whether she will return to Hollywood by plane. She had
