

Man Arraigned On Burglary Charges

LITTLE VALLEY — A Salamanca man appeared in Cattaraugus County Court on Monday to face a charge of burglary at the business offices of the New York & Lake Erie Railroad in Gowanda.

Matthew Piscitelli, 24, had been indicted April 13 by a grand jury. The indictment was sealed, however, pending his arrest. On Saturday, Piscitelli was located in Salamanca and he was taken into custody shortly before 5 p.m. Sunday by Salamanca Police and Cattaraugus County Sheriff's deputies.

He is charged with third-degree burglary and third-degree grand larceny filed in connection with the alleged

entry of the office owned by Robert O. Dingman on July 20. A cash box and about \$250 was removed, according to the police report. Dingman testified before a grand jury April 13.

An attorney was appointed to defend Piscitelli and arraignment was scheduled for April 30.

In another case, William J. Baer, 32, of Olean, pleaded guilty to driving while intoxicated and driving without a license or insurance on April 9 in Olean. He also pleaded guilty to driving without a license, again in Olean, on April 15. Sentencing is scheduled for May 21. Baer's bail was set at \$250.
