

Railroad Offers Chances To Look At Fall Foliage

GOWANDA — A schedule of fall foliage excursions is to be offered by the New York and Lake Erie Railroad.

Sixty-mile Saturday excursions are planned for Sept. 22, Oct. 20 and Oct. 27. All leave the Gowanda depot at 10:30 a.m. and return in the early evening. Included in the trips will be a tour of a restored depot, a photo stop or two, complimentary wine for adults and ice cream cones for children.

Each Sunday, continuing through October, a two-hour round-trip excursion will leave Gowanda depot at 1 p.m. and at 3:30 p.m. These trips will be destined for South Dayton's depot, where Robert Redford was filmed in the movie *The Natural*. No reservations are required for Sunday trips.

For die-hard rail fans, a "Railfan's Holiday" has been scheduled for Saturday, Oct. 13. This 90-mile trip will be

the longest of the year. More photo stops are planned, and complimentary champagne or ice cream will be offered.

Hot dogs, snacks, and beverages will be sold on board on day-long trips. Passengers may bring picnics.
