



**WHERE FIVE MET FLAMING DEATH**—General view of crash scene near Blockville shortly after Saturday's tragedy (top) with spectators gazing at black smoke curling up from blazing gasoline. Plane cut swath over knoll (extreme left) and ended up in gully. Wreckage can be seen, with part of tail assembly (center near auto) thrown far to right. Note hose line, extreme left. Firemen ran hose 5,000 feet from creek to wreckage. Below, closeup of wreckage in gully, fiercely burning. Five men were either trapped in remains of fuselage or thrown nearby. Note bent and twisted three-blade propellor, hurled high on bank yards from wreckage. All four propellers were found torn loose from motors.
