New Directors Named By Union-National

Aldor M. Nord, president of Union-National Inc., has announced the election of two additional members to the firm's board of directors.

They are: John M. Abrahamson, general manager of Burns Case Goods Corp., a subsidiary of Union-National; and Donald W. Haggerty, sales manager for the firm's midwest division with headquarters in the Merchandise Mart, Chicago, Ill.

Mr. Abrahamson, a native of Jamestown and a 1940 graduate of Jamestown High School, joined Union-National in 1946 after serving during World War II with the U.S. Army adjutant general department at general headquarters, Southwest Pacific Area.

He was in charge of the firm's cost department until 1958, when he was named office manager. Since 1964, he has been general manager at Burns Case Goods Corp.

Recalled to active duty in 1951, Mr. Haggerty served as a navy lieutenant and instructor at the Fleet Sonar School, Key West, Fla., until 1953 when he returned to Union-National. He was transferred to Chicago in 1955.
