  - a. Dawn Seyler, Library Associate, started in December.
- 4. Director's Report Anne Greene
  - a. We started offering a new Teen Game Night in January and we welcomed six teens at the first session the teens said they loved it!
  - b. We reorganized our early readers so that they are arranged by reading level, notated with colored stickers, and the cover facing out. We have seen a significant increase in checkouts of these materials.
  - c. We welcomed Infinity Visual and Performing Arts and the Children's Music Studio to the library on a no school day, to provide free music-based programming for children. We had 23 children and 15 adults attend those programs that day.
  - d. Two of our staff members visited Jamestown High School to share information about our new teen programs and the library's online resources. The staff worked with 40 high schoolers from three different English classes.

e. The new table, chairs, whiteboard, and storage, which were grant-funded by CRCF, have all been delivered and assembled. The updated space is much more visually appealing and the new whiteboard offers increased functionality for our patrons thanks to the generous grant from CRCF.

### **DIRECTOR'S REPORT / February 2023**

### **PROGRAMMING & SERVICES**

### Midwinter Break Makerspace Success

We have been working to provide more opportunities for drop-in play in the Makerspace. Over Midwinter Break, we opened the Makerspace for open play from 11:00-3:30 each day. Over four days (we were closed on Monday), we welcomed 134 visitors to these drop-in sessions in the Makerspace. We also had 74 attendees at our staff-led afternoon Makerspace programming over the course of the break. We are thrilled to see the popularity of this all-ages educational space continue to expand.

### **Books and Brews Popularity**

Patrons have frequently requested a book club for adults and we are excited to offer this program now. This fun monthly event meets at Brazil on the second Wednesday evening of each month. At our first meeting in February, we welcomed 17 attendees who had very positive responses to the new program.

### **New Saturday Crafting**

We have heard requests from patrons for programming options on Saturdays to accommodate a wider range of schedules. We are now offering crafting for adults on Saturday afternoons. Our first Saturday session was in February, with eight attendees.

### COLLECTION

### **Shelf Reading Progress**

Our staff have been working hard in the collection to ensure the accuracy of our shelving. We have dedicated staff time to this on an ongoing basis, and have now shelf-read the entire collection in the course of 4 months. Every section has been checked for accuracy as recently as November.

### Readers' Advisory Services

The library has always provided in-person readers' advisory for patrons seeking advice about new materials to read. Now we also offer an online form so patrons can request guidance from home or on the go; patrons fill out a survey about their interests, and a librarian will respond with recommended materials. This form is featured on the homepage of our website.

### **OUTREACH & PARTNERSHIPS**

### Materials for Mental Health Association and the St. Susan Center

We reached out to the MHA and St. Susan to offer materials to MHA and St. Susan as they have a new overnight shelter for people who are homeless. The library is providing free books and magazines for adults that can be kept at these facilities and provided to visitors.

### **Translation Services from Catchafire**

Catchafire is a service provided to the library at no cost from the Sheldon Foundation, and it connects volunteers with non-profits to complete projects. This is the third year the Sheldon Foundation has generously granted us this service, and it has helped the library's operations and services improve tremendously. Recently, Catchafire added translation as

a service they provide, and the library has been connecting with volunteers to generate more documents in Spanish for our patrons.

### Yearbooks Loaned for CHQ Hall of Fame Project

The library's collection of Jamestown High School yearbooks are typically available only for use in the library. We loaned them to the CHQ Hall of Fame this month for a project as they recognized JHS graduates from 2000-2004.

### **LIBRARY NEWS**

### New Staff

We have welcomed a new Building Attendant on our team. Aden Williams has been busy training with our current Building Attendant this past month.

### New Crosswalk

The City of Jamestown Department of Development will be submitting a grant for support to design and install a creative/artistic sidewalk on 6th Street between the library and Dow Park. If awarded the grant funding, the new walkway will be a book themed crosswalk. We are very excited about this proposed project, which would have significant benefits in terms of safety and aesthetics.

### **GRANT UPDATES**

### Carnahan-Jackson Grant Application

We were awarded a generous grant of \$47,750 from the Carnahan-Jackson Foundation for various energy saving improvements to the library. The library received guidance from the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority and our building was the subject of a "Green Jobs, Green New York" Energy Study. The study was comprehensive and the final report outlined energy and cost saving measures which we are now able to implement thanks to the Carnahan-Jackson Foundation's support of this important project.

### **Grant Funded Midwinter Break Programs**

With remaining funds from our 2022 Empowering Our Community grant from the Chautauqua Region Community Foundation, we were able to offer two special programs for kids and teens over the Jamestown Public Schools' Midwinter break. For kids, we offered a "Make a Doodlebot" program, where participants build a functioning robot that moves and draws with markers. For teens, we ran a "Make a Neon Sign," program, and teens had a blast designing their own custom neon signs. Both programs reached their registration capacity and participants (and staff) had lots of STEMfocused fun!

### 2023 Cummins Grant Application

Our grant application to provide free books for children and teens has moved to the next stage in consideration with the Cummins Foundation. We are now waiting to hear back on a final decision about this grant award.

### Food and Drink Policy

The James Prendergast Library strives to create a welcoming, clean and comfortable environment for all to enjoy. Consistent with this goal, food and drink are allowed in the Library on a limited basis and should be consumed in a considerate and responsible manner. Food and drink pose a potential risk to library collections, equipment, and furnishings. In order to protect our resources and facilities from damage, we ask that you act responsibly when consuming food and drink in the Library.

- Beverages are allowed if they are in a spill-proof cup, container with a secure lid, a can, or
  plastic bottle with a screw top. Glass or open containers are not allowed.
- No alcoholic beverages are allowed in the Library.
- If your food or beverage has strong odors or is otherwise disturbing others, you will be asked to
  move to a separate space or remove it from the Library.
- Certain areas of the Library are designated as "snack" zones.
- Food and drinks are not permitted while using library computers, printers, photocopiers, microfilm readers or other electrical equipment.
- Food and drinks are not permitted while using the Library's local history materials.
- Food and drink are permissible for special functions in Library meeting rooms as authorized by library management. Rules for food and beverages are detailed under the Library's Meeting Room Policy. Staff will assist with meeting room arrangements depending on availability of meeting room spaces.
- Library users must
  - Immediately report spills to staff.
  - Discard food and drink refuse in trash containers.
  - Leave all areas clean for use by others.
- Patrons violating this policy will be asked to remove their food and drink from the Library.
- Unattended food and drink openly displayed in public areas will be confiscated and discarded.
- Library users are liable for any damage to library materials or equipment.
